## Exhibit explores Siouxland's native peoples

Pottery remnants, projectile points, stone and animal bone tools, colorful quill and beadwork, and original artwork are featured in ***Siouxland's First Peoples: 1100 to 1800 A.D.*** now on display at the Sioux City Public Museum.

Over the past 1,000 years native people ranging from the prehistoric Mill Creek and Oneota cultures to the historic period Yanktonai and Santee have left elements of their material culture behind. Only a portion of these artifacts from the Museum's collection have been on public display over the years. The exhibit also features the original artwork of Winnebago artist Chuck Raymond (1931-1989) whose pencil renderings provide an imaginative depiction of native life.

***Siouxland's First Peoples: 1100 to 1800 A.D.*** will be on display through March 21, 2010. The Sioux City Public Museum is housed in the historic John Peirce Mansion at 2901 Jackson Street in Sioux City. Regular hours are Tuesday through Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. Admission is free.
