Program to focus on Greenville neighborhood

(Sioux City) – Historic maps and photographs highlight the story of one of Sioux City's oldest neighborhoods and its namesake in the presentation, **Greenville: Tom Green's Village** on Thursday, September 22 at 6:00 p.m. at the Sioux City Public Museum. The program is free and open to the public.

Presenter Grace Linden, the Sioux City Public Museum's curator of history, will discuss the Floyd River Floods, buildings, houses and people who have lived in the area throughout its history.

Early resident Tom Green, along with his son, built brickyards in the Greenville area. Besides the brick industry, there have been other industries, retail businesses, schools, churches, government buildings and parks, which all make up this unique area of Sioux City. Greenville was described in an early document as being "South of the Floyd Cemetery and east of the Floyd River. People are encouraged to bring their photographs of Greenville to the museum to be donated or copied for future research.
