Film about 4th Street to be shown

Revisit the heyday of the area that is now known as "Historic 4th Street" with the **Tuesday Twilight Talk: "High Times on Lower 4th"** on Tuesday, August 17 at 6:30 p.m. at the Sioux City Public Museum. "High Times on Lower 4th" is the latest film from the award-winning team at G.R. Lindblade & Co. Seating is limited; reservations are required by calling 712-279-6174.

Fourth Street was literally Sioux City's Main Street when shopping was concentrated in a six block stretch, mostly west of Jackson Street. The east end of Fourth Street was another matter entirely. With a large military presence during the war years, farmers and ranchers bringing livestock to the Stock Yards and liquor by the drink illegal until the late 60s, Lower Fourth turned into the rough and tumble, steamy center of trouble and rollicking fun. The 63-minute film is a look at both ends of Fourth Street, from the folks who worked it, policed it and witnessed it.

Twenty people were interviewed for the project and pieces of their stories intertwine to give a feel of what "Historic Fourth" was like in its heyday. "High Times on Lower 4th" was filmed by George Lindblade, produced by Christine McAvoy and edited by Lou Ann Lindblade. The team at G.R. Lindblade & Co. have earned scores of awards for their video projects, including five Telly Awards.

Housed in the historic John Peirce Mansion at 2901 Jackson Street, the Sioux City Public Museum offers monthly Tuesday Twilight Talk programs featuring topics of regional historic interest.
