Walking tour presented as part of Historic Preservation Week

The scene of one of the city's most notorious crimes is featured in the **Pearl and Water Street Walking Tour** on Tuesday, May 4 beginning at 6:30 p.m. at the Pearl Street Research Center, 407 Pearl Street.

Along with visiting the marker where Rev. George C. Haddock was murdered, the tour will show the sites of several of Sioux City's "firsts" – the first store, Tootle & Jackson General Store; the first saw mill, Sanborn and Follett; the first house, Joseph Leonais' house; and the first packing house, Booge Packing.

Some of the buildings on the tour which are still standing include the Simmons Hardware Store more recently known as the Battery Building; the Dineen Block (4th Street Cafe and Dalton's Pub); the former Fire Station #1; and the Charles Breun Grocery (Pearl Street Research Center).

The tour will be led by Grace Linden, curator of history at the Sioux City Public Museum, as part of Historic Preservation Week activities. The free walking tour will last approximately hour.
